age the use of cigarettes among our baseball boys, knowing the great harm that tobacco has done to those in the habit of using it."

Ex-president Herbert Hoover once said, "There is no agency in the world that is so seriously affecting the health, education, efficiency, and character of boys and girls as the cigarette habit. Nearly every delinquent boy is a cigarette smoker. Cigarettes are a source of crime. To neglect crime at its source is a shortsighted policy, unworthy of a nation of our intelligence."

Thomas A. Edison denounced the cigarette as "producing a degeneration of the cells of the brain which . . . . is permanent and uncontrollable."

There is a shortage of skilled labor. Luther Burbank said: "The men I found unable to do the delicate work of building invariably turned out to be smokers or drinkers. These men . . . do the rough work of farming . . . owing to inability to concentrate their nerve force, on the more delicate tasks."
