

The Health Ministers of the various States are meeting at the moment and I anticipate that they will be unable to come to an agreement about a nation-wide advertising ban. However, both South Australia and Western Australia look as though they will have a Tobacco Advertising Bill before their Houses of Parliament within the next twelve months. Hopefully, if we can get the Bill passed in one or other of the States there will be a domino effect.

How are things going in New York? I guess you will be attending the 5th World Conference on Smcking and Health in July. Steve Woodward will be going from W.A. representing the Australian Council on Smoking and Health, which remains in good heart. I am afraid I will not be there myself in the flesh, although I will be in spirit.
