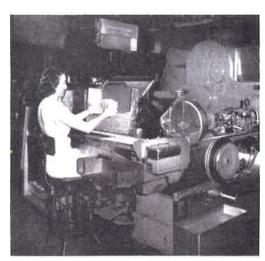

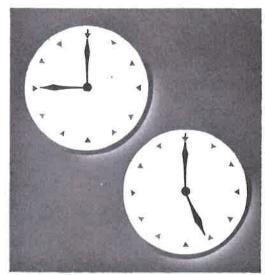

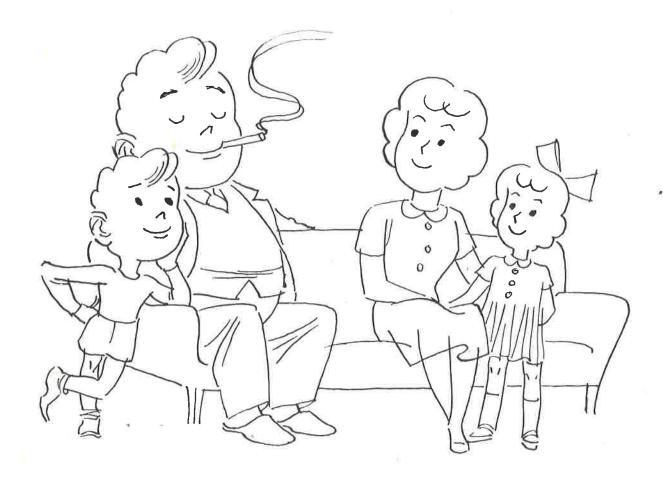
RETIREMENT INCOME

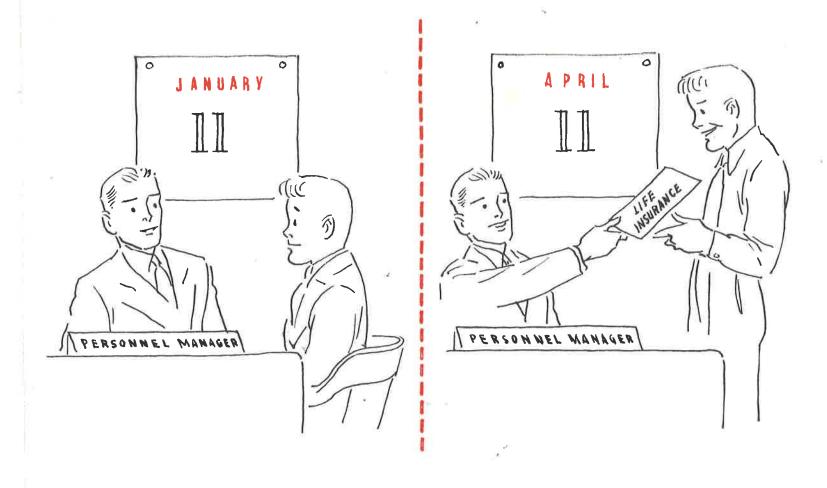
LIFE INSURANCE
