## BIOGRAPHY OF PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES

WILLIAM HOWARD TAFT, Republican.

Born Sept. 15, 1857, at Cincinnati, O.; educated at Yale; graduated in 1878; elected class orator; graduated from Cincinnati College of Law in 1880, dividing the first prize; admitted to bar of Supreme Court of Ohio, May, 1880; became law reporter of "Cincinnati Times"; in 1887 appointed judge of Supreme Court of Cincinnati; 1890 appointed Solicitor General of U. S.; 1900 appointed Pres. of U. S. Philippine Commission; 1901 appointed first civil governor of Philippines; 1902 visited Rome to confer with Pope Leo XIII, regarding Friar Lands in Philippines; 1904 became Secretary of War in Roosevelt's cabinet; 1907 visited Philippine Islands to inaugurate Philippine Assembly; 1908 elected President of the United States.

ROBERT MARION LA FOLLETTE,  
Progressive Republican.

Born at Primrose, Wisconsin, June 14, 1855; graduated from State University of Wisconsin, June 1879; admitted to the bar February, 1880; elected to 49th Congress in 1886; elected Governor of Wisconsin in 1900; re-elected in 1902 and again in 1904; elected to the U. S. Senate, Jan. 25, 1905; re-elected in 1911; his time expires March 3, 1917. He resides at Madison, Wisconsin.

THEODORE ROOSEVELT, Republican.

Born in New York City, October 27, 1858; graduated from Harvard, 1880, and took up study of law; 1881 elected to the New York Legislature and twice re-elected; 1884 went to North Dakota and spent several years on a cattle ranch; 1895 accepted presidency of Police Commission of New York City; 1897 appointed assistant Secretary of Navy; 1898 resigned at outbreak of war with Spain; made Colonel of 1st U. S. Volunteer Cavalry and was at the fight of Las Guasimas and San Juan; 1898 nominated for Vice-President and succeeded to the Presidency upon the death of McKinley; 1904 was elected President with a popular plurality of about 2,500,000 votes; residence, Oyster Bay, Long Island, N. Y.

## BIOGRAPHY OF PRESIDENTIAL CANDIDATES

Continued.

JUDSON HARMON, Democrat.

Governor of Ohio; Professor of law, University of Cincinnati, since 1896; elected Governor of Ohio for term 1905-11; was re-elected; was Receiver C. H. & D., Pere Marquette, and Toledo Terminal Railway, 1905-09; Attorney-General of United States in Cabinet of President Cleveland for two years; was judge of Court of Common Pleas two years, and of the Superior Court one year; President Ohio Bar Association one year; born Feb. 3, 1846, at Newton, Ohio; educated at Denison University and at the Cincinnati Law School.

ALBERT BAIRD CUMMINS,  
Progressive Republican.

Was born at Carmichaels, Pa., Feb. 15, 1850; followed his father's trade of carpenter; earned enough money to take a two year's course at Waynesburg College, worked for several years as railroad surveyor; at the age of twenty-three became a student in a Chicago law office; in 1878 he removed to Des Moines, where he established his reputation as one of the ablest lawyers in Iowa; elected Governor in 1901 and served two terms; in 1908 elected U. S. Senator.

CHAMP CLARK, Democrat.

Born March 7, 1850, in Anderson Co., Ky.; educated at Kentucky University, Bethany College and Cincinnati Law School; 1873-74 President of Marshall College, West Va., and for twenty-two years held the record for being the youngest college president in the United States; worked as farm hand, clerked in a country store, edited newspaper and practiced law; moved to Missouri in 1875; 1904 permanent Chairman of Democrat National Convention at St. Louis; elected to 53d, 55th, 56th, 57th, 58th 59th, 60th, 61st and 62d Congress; unanimous nominee of Democrats in Congress for Speakership of 61st Congress, again unanimously nominated for Speaker of 62d Congress, and elected April 4, 1911. Residence, Bowling Green, Mo.
